#### On-campus

## **Theology and Counselling**

This unique programme has a relational integrative framework which combines the studying of counselling with study of theology. At the heart of the programme is a relational integrative model of counselling, which roots counselling in a Christian understanding of people's fundamental needs for Relationality, Embodiment, Meaning and Agency.

The primary approach to counselling followed is psychodynamic in that it looks at deep-seated reasons and root causes. Students are required to have personal therapy as part of their clinical development which equips them to practice within an ethical and professional framework. At diploma and degree level, students are also required to undertake client work in a voluntary placement.

Counsellors can work in settings such as education, charities, alcohol and drugs agencies and GP practices. This is a BACP accredited course.
